A Message from the Principal



When the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions started to come into place, and online teaching and learning ensued, I dropped into various classes to see how our students were coping with the unprecedented developments. In one of the Year 11 classes, the students enthusiastically explained to me that the new restrictions were not about social distancing, but rather 'distance socialising'.

This 'distance socialising' remark demonstrated the endearing and resilient nature of our students and also served as a reminder of just how proud we are of each of them. There is no doubt that over the past weeks, all of our students, staff, and families have faced a steep learning curve. Our determination to overcome these challenges together are a true indication of the strong three-way partnerships shared and enjoyed by the staff, students and families here at Kildare College. Despite the incessant changes that often took place at little notice, our students always demonstrated resilience, an openness to embracing new ways, and an exceptional understanding of what we could control and, conversely, what we could not. In many ways, the past weeks have empowered our students to be more independent and to gain confidence. They were able to translate what was an unpredictable situation into one that allowed them to seek and embrace new ways of learning, whilst 'distance socialising'.

Our staff demonstrated how willing and able they were, as evident in their efficient switch to online learning. The professionalism, collaboration and collegiality of the staff highlighted the unfailing dedication and love of each staff member. Furthermore, it was testimony to their shared commitment to ensuring all of our students are learning to the best of their ability.

To our valued families, these past weeks have certainly been different from anything we have experienced before, both as a College community and as a collective world. For those of you who have been supporting your daughter's learning at home, whilst also trying to navigate through the individual implications of this situation with your respective families, we applaud you on the great work that you have done. On behalf of all of us at Kildare College, a big thank you for the harmonious way in which we have all worked together to make the most of an otherwise difficult situation.

We also sincerely understand that there are some families in our school who have faced a lack of employment security, with far-reaching consequences on the family income and lifestyle. Once again, we would like to assure you that if you do find yourself in this situation, please know that your daughter is valued above all else and her enrolment is not in jeopardy. What is most important to us is that your daughter/s education remains steadfast and that, as a community, we remain well-connected by maintaining open lines of communication. It was great to hear the sound of excited voices and to see the sense of joy on the faces of the students as they returned to school over the past two weeks. Many spoke of how much they had missed being with their friends and teachers in person during these past weeks. Most students have appreciated the dedicated work of their teachers in preparing online lessons and resources, but their preference was clearly for the face-to-face experience of being together in class and at school.

For our Year 11 and 12 students this has been an interesting, evolving and out of the ordinary year thus far of study. The SACE board has been working hard to ensure that students will be able to complete their Year 12 studies this year. The majority of subjects will continue as usual for the year, including the scheduled exams at the end of the year. Some minor changes in subject areas have been made and teachers will inform students of any changes that affect them.

Year 12 students have the requirement of additional homework in each subject area, and managing sleep, exercise and down-time as well as social contact with peers is also very important during these times. It is important that the Year 12s quickly pick-up where they left at the end of Term 1 and find ways to ensure they catch up if needed before the end of Term 2.

On a brighter note, the Year 12 Jackets have arrived – just in time for the colder months. As you can imagine, students were very excited to receive them. The jackets are part of the College uniform and can be worn with winter, summer and PE uniforms.

Due to the impact of the coronavirus, and in order to further support your daughter we have had to reschedule some events including the examinations for this semester. Examinations are used to identify concepts students have learnt, identify areas of concern and are an important part of the feedback process. Results from examinations provide further information that is used during the subject selection process for students moving into Year 11 and 12.

The end of semester examinations for Year 10 and 11 students will be held in Week 9 of this term.

Year 10 - Week 9, Thursday 25 June and Friday 26 June Year 11 - Week 9, Wednesday 24 June – Friday 26 June Mid-year examinations for Year 12 students will be held during the school holidays so they do not impact on teaching time.

Year 12 - Week 2 of the Term 2 holidays, Monday 13 July - Wednesay 15 July


Examinations are compulsory for all students sitting a subject that has an exam at the end of Year 12. More information will be released once the timetables have been finalised.

At the end of last term you would have received an email from the College explaining how to access the Parent Portal to your daughter's

Maths Pathway program. By accessing this portal, you can view your daughter's progress over the year. This includes her Test History, Learning Dashboard and her Overall Learning.


- The Test History shows you the full results of each test she has undertaken this year. You will be able to view her growth, effort and accuracy rates for each test.
- The growth rate tells you how much your daughter is learning, an average of 100% growth means your daughter is on track to learn one year's worth of learning.
- The effort rate tells you how much work your daughter is completing in a learning cycle. An effort rate of 100% indicates that your daughter is completing all of the work assigned to her. Anything above 100% indicates she is completing more work than expected and anything below means she has not been able to complete all modules assigned.
- The accuracy rate explains the level of accuracy your daughter demonstrated in her test. 100% accuracy indicates that she mastered all of the modules undertaken in the learning cycle. You will also see that your daughter records these results, along with her learning goals in SEQTA Assessments at the end of each learning cycle.
- The Learning Dashboard details each module that your daughter has attempted and mastered this year. You can clearly see the modules that she has mastered, the modules she is working on and the modules with which she has had some difficulty. By simply clicking on the name of the module you will be taken directly to the resources for the module, which includes the worksheet and the supporting video.
- The Overall Learning Grid maps your daughter's Mathematical knowledge and understanding directly to the Australian Curriculum. The Mathematics she already knows is shown in pale yellow and the Mathematics she does not know yet is shown in blue. The Mathematics she has learned this year appears in a dark gold colour.

We strongly encourage you to take some time to log in and familiarise yourself with the Parent Portal. We would also encourage you to register your name and email address so that you can receive updates on your daughter's progress. If you have any questions or concerns please feel free to contact your daughter's Mathematics teacher, or myself, for a conversation.
